

CHAPTER V

JOHN BALDWIN OF LOUDOUN COUNTY, VIRGINIA

John Baldwin first appeared in Loudoun County, Virginia records in 1769 when his name was carried on the list of Loudoun County Tithables. Thereafter, he appeared on the tithable lists for 1770, 1773, 1774, 1781, and 1785. (103)

He apparently died in Loudoun County in the year 1825. An inventory of his estate was dated, July 11, 1825. He died intestate and the settlement of his estate took ten years with the final account being filed in July, 1835. At first, his son Mahlon was appointed administrator, but this son died in 1834. Mahlon's son-in-law, John L. Chamblin, was then appointed administrator of the estate and filed the final account. The 1825 inventory shows that John Baldwin owned slaves. The inventory totalled: \$822.50. (141:P299; Q334; V311; W87,217) Payments from the estate were made to John Baldwin's sons in 1829: James, Samuel, and Stacey. Similar payments were also made to John Whitacre and David Ewer who were probably sons-in-law. (141:W217)

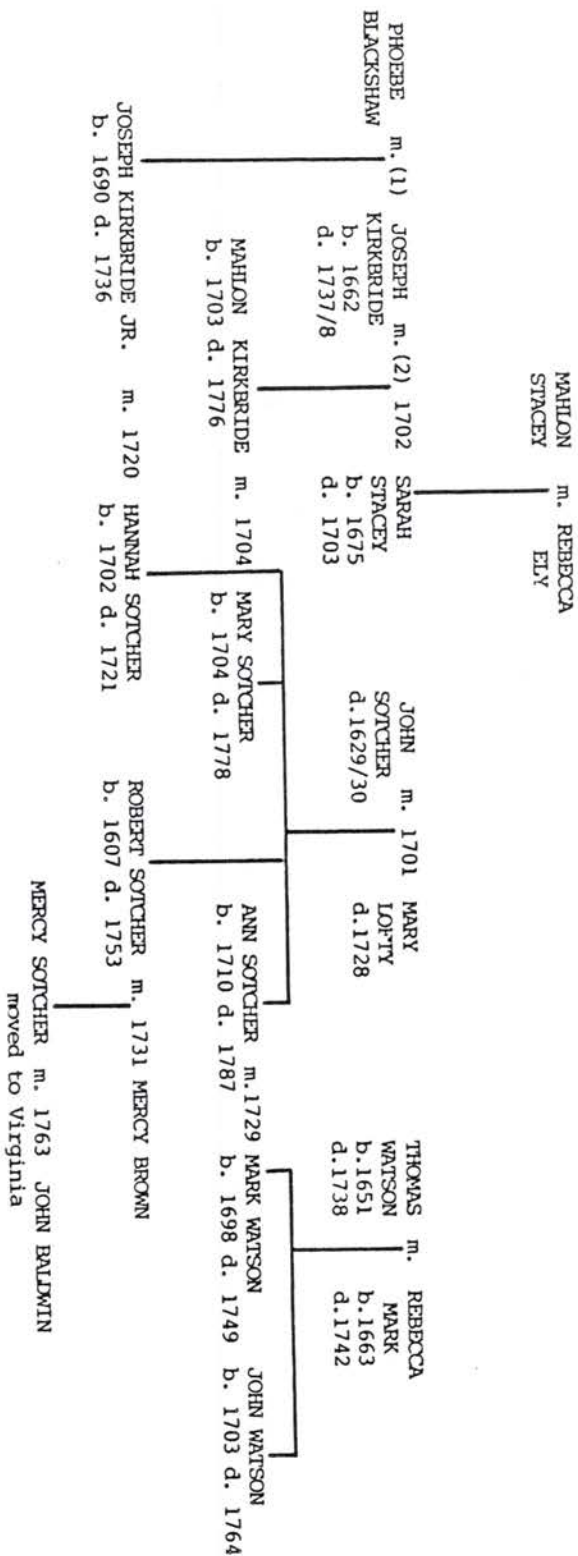
John Baldwin was probably twice married. At the time of his death, the name of his widow was Elizabeth. She died in March, 1839. (141:Z237) But, his first wife was probably Mercy ("Massy") Sotcher, the daughter of Robert and Mercy (Brown) Sotcher of Bucks County, Pennsylvania.

The marriage of John Baldwin and Mercy Sotcher took place April 4, 1763 at the Reformed Dutch Church of Churchville, Bucks Co., PA. The church apparently was located at Richboro, Bucks Co., from 1751 until a new building was built at Churchville in 1814. (142) Mercy (Sotcher) Baldwin was disowned by Falls Monthly Meeting of Friends for marriage out of unity on 7th, 9mo. 1763. (114:976)

A John Baldwin was listed on the tax list of Middletown Tp., Bucks Co. in 1761. He was identified as "single" and living at "Watson's." He also appeared as a single man on the tax list of the same township in 1762. (143) We may surmise from this entry, that John Baldwin was a hired man working for John Watson (1703-1764) who moved from Bristol to Middletown Tp., Bucks Co., in 1734. John Watson had a brother, Mark Watson (1698-1749) who had married Ann Sotcher, an aunt of Mercy (Sotcher) Baldwin. (144:335) John Baldwin's employment at Watsons may have introduced him to his future wife.

A John Baldwin was listed on the 1764 tax list of Lower Makefield Township. This could have been John Baldwin, after his marriage and after the death of his employer, John Watson. (143) This was the last mention of this John Baldwin in Bucks Co., PA.

Ancestry of Mercy (Sotcher) Baldwin

Mercy Sotcher was the daughter of Robert and Mercy (Brown) Sotcher of Bucks Co., PA. Robert Sotcher, her father, was born in 1706 at Pennsbury, Bucks Co., PA and probably died in 1753 in Bucks Co. He married in 1731, Mercy Brown, dau. of George and Mercy Browne. They came to Bucks Co., from Leicestershire, England in 1679. George Browne was the first English justice commissioned in Bucks Co., in 1680. (144:131)

Robert Sotcher was the son of John and Mary (Lofty) Sotcher. His father, John Sotcher, came from Sussex Co., England to America with William Penn in 1699, and was employed at Pennsbury, Penn's estate in Bucks Co. Mary Lofty (or Loftus) came from Bristol, England in 1694 and was also employed at Pennsbury. John Sotcher and Mary Lofty were married at Falls Monthly Meeting in Bucks Co. in 1701. They continued in Penn's service until 1714 and then moved and operated a ferry nearby. John Sotcher died in 1729. (144:149) John and Mary (Lofty) Sotcher had four children: (1) Hannah who married Joseph Kirkbride, Jr., (2) Mary, who m. Mahlon Kirkbride, (3) Robert, mentioned above, and (4) Ann, who m. Mark Watson, whose brother, John Watson probably employed John Baldwin in Middletown Tp., in the 1760's. (see chart)

Connecting John Baldwin of Bucks Co., PA with John Baldwin of Loudoun Co, VA

Although we have no definite proof that the John Baldwin who appeared in Loudoun Co., VA in 1769 was the same John Baldwin who married Mercy Sotcher in 1763 in Bucks Co., there is considerable evidence linking the two. Jane Bray stated in her book, "Quaker Saga", that John and Mercy (Sotcher) Baldwin moved to VA. The same book shows that Mercy (Sotcher) Baldwin had an uncle, Mahlon Kirkbride, who m. her father's sister, Mary Sotcher and owned large tracts of land in Loudoun Co., VA. This Mahlon Kirkbride was a life-long friend of John Watson of Middletown Tp, Bucks Co, for whom John Baldwin worked. Kirkbride may have influenced John Baldwin to move to Loudoun Co., and may have employed him in managing the Kirkbride land holdings there. John Baldwin named two of his sons, Mahlon and Stacey, and a grandson was named, "Mahlon Kirkbride Baldwin".

In the Charles Candee Baldwin collection at Western Reserve Historical Society in Cleveland, OH, is a letter written ca. 1874 by Benjamin F. Baldwin, a grandson of John Baldwin. He referred to his grandmother Baldwin as a "Quakeress from Pennsylvania" but, did not give her name. This fact was published in C. C. Baldwin's account of the family in his 1881 Baldwin Genealogy. (15:798) Mercy Sotcher came from a well-known Quaker family of Bucks Co. and would fit this description. At least one grandchild of John Baldwin was named, "Massa" Baldwin, a diminutive form of Mercy, which Mercy (Sotcher) Baldwin herself used in her lifetime.

Therefore, in spite of the fact that no record in VA named John Baldwin's first wife as Mercy Sotcher, the occurrence of Sotcher family names among his offspring gives credence to this connection.

Ancestry of John Baldwin

John Baldwin was probably a son of the Joseph Baldwin Sr., mentioned in the previous chapter who moved from Chester Co., PA to Loudoun Co., VA with his wife, Ann, (sometimes called Susannah). The two Baldwin families arrived in Loudoun Co., VA about the same time. John Baldwin appeared first in 1769 and Joseph Baldwin Sr. and Jr. appeared in 1773. In both families, the names, John, Joseph, and Samuel were used frequently. Joseph Baldwin, Jr. named a daughter, "Massa", probably after his brother John's wife, Mercy or Massy (Sotcher) Baldwin. If the thesis about Joseph Baldwin, Sr.'s ancestry in the previous chapter is correct, then Joseph Baldwin, Sr. would have grown up with Mahlon Kirkbride, Robert Sotcher and John and Mark Watson in Bristol, Bucks Co. Though Joseph Baldwin moved away from Bristol in 1734, (to Philadelphia and later to Marple Tp., Chester Co) it is conceivable that his son, John Baldwin might have gone to work for an old family friend, John Watson, in Bucks Co. when he came of age in the early 1760's.

Hannah _____ who was born Apr. 23, 1785; d. Mar. 27, 1858 in Muskingum Co. (147) She was baptized at Salt Creek Baptist Church in Aug. 1816. (125) Samuel Baldwin moved from Loudoun Co., VA to Belmont Co., OH between 1807 when his dau. Charlotte was born and 1809 when he signed a deed. On May 30, 1809, he purchased 80A. in Muskingum Co. from James Johnson of Steubenville, for \$400.00. (148:8:120) When he died intestate in 1830, this land passed to his children. By 1857, the son, James had bought out the other heirs and became the owner of his father's 80A. farm. (148) Children of Samuel and Hannah Baldwin: (order of birth uncertain) (148)

 Baldwin was cited by the Goose Creek Friends Meeting in Loudoun Co. for
 marriage out of unity on 29th of the 4th month, 1813. Her acknowledgement
 was accepted later that same year. (151) Mahlon Baldwin witnessed the Will
 of Thomas Brown, uncle to his future wife on the 23rd, 4mo., 1794. (152)
 On Oct. 6, 1802, Mahlon Baldwin purchased 90A. from Burr and Catharine
 Powell. This land lay along the road leading from Middleburg to Colston's
 Mill. (5:2D:45) On Sept. 10, 1804, Mahlon purchased 64A. from John and
 Hannah Inden. (5:2E:218) This land lay along the east side of Goose Creek
 apparently close to the previously described tract. On July 18, 1822,
 Mahlon Baldwin purchased one acre in the town of Union, from the parents of
 his wife. (5:3E:400) On Jan. 26, 1824, he purchased another lot in Union
 from John and Harriet Keene. (5:3H:58) In the 1850 Census, Ruth Baldwin,
 widow of Mahlon, was living in Loudoun Co., with her daughter and son-in-law,
 Sarah and Jonah Tavenner. (p. 241) She lived with her son, Mahlon K.
 Baldwin near Philamont, VA as late as 1874. (154) Children of Mahlon and

E5 Stacey Baldwin² (John¹) was born in Loudoun Co., VA. He was probably the Stacey Baldwin who married Margaret McVeigh in Loudoun Co. on Aug. 22, 1805. (146) (McVeigh relatives were mentioned in the estate settlement of his son, Mahlon Baldwin). He was probably also the Stacey Baldwin who was listed on a 1793 Loudoun Co. militia list. (153) He was listed in the 1810 Census of Loudoun Co. as between 26 and 45 years of age. He was not listed in the 1820 VA census which may indicate that he died rather young. (15:799) Her father came from the "North of Ireland", married in NJ, served in the Revolutionary War and settled in Middleburg, VA where he lived to the age of 100 years. (154) James and Sarah (Henderson) Baldwin came to what is now Taylor Co., WV in 1844. (15:799) Their children: (154)

(76) (86) They were residents of Goshen Tp., Hardin Co., OH at the time of the 1850 census, (p. 154) but were back in Perry Tp., Muskingum Co. at the time of the 1860 census. (p. 130) According to the records of the Salt Creek Baptist Church, Charlotte Russell was received by letter on Sept. 3, 1842 and "excluded" Dec. 2, 1848. (125) Children: (order of birth uncertain) (149)

(p. 154) At that time, they lived next to Massa's sister, Charlotte and her husband, James Russell. In the 1860 census, the Hawks were listed in Cessna Tp., Hardin Co. E15 James Baldwin³ (Samuel² John¹) was born Jan. 9, 1818 in OH and died Sept. 22, 1895 in Perry Tp., Muskingum Co. (147) He never married, but is said to have gone west in the Gold Rush of 1849. (155:127) With his earnings, he returned to Perry Tp. and purchased several farms, including that of his father. At the time of his death in 1895, he owned numerous tracts in Perry and Salt Creek Tps. A considerable estate was divided among the living sisters, nieces, and nephews. (149)

E17 Sarah J. Baldwin³ (Samuel² John¹) was born ca. 1822 in OH. (76) On May 12, 1842 in Muskingum Co., OH, she m. James McCracken. (128) He was born ca. 1821 in Maryland. By the time of the 1870 census, they were living in Knoxville, Knox Co., IL. (p. 35) James McCracken was listed as township assessor in that year. Stacey Baldwin came to Van Buren Co., IA in 1839 and spent the rest of his life in Van Buren and Jefferson Co., IA. (164) Prior to 1839, he res. somewhere in OH. - E84 Elzada Jane Baldwin, b. Jan. 16, 1852 in IA; d. Oct. 24, 1935 in Fairfield, IA. On Oct. 22, 1868, she m. Mace Clinkenbeard in Keosauqua, IA. He was b. in 1847; d. 1915. Elzada Jane Clinkenbeard was bur. in Evergreen Cem. in Fairfield. She and her husband had eleven children. (164)

E29 William Baldwin³ (Stacey² John¹) was probably born about 1808 in Loudoun Co., VA. He was probably the same William Baldwin who lived in Fauquier Co., VA at the time of the 1860 census. The town of Middleburg, VA where many of this Baldwin family lived, was very close to the Fauquier Co. line and William Baldwin may have lived just across this line. - E30 Lucinda Baldwin³ (Stacey² John¹) was born ca. 1813 in Loudoun Co., VA; died Nov. 24, 1881. (159) She married Thomas Jones Sept. 1, 1834 in Loudoun Co. (146) who was b. ca. 1801 and d. Apr. 15, 1884. (159) They were bur. at North Fork Baptist Church in Loudoun Co., VA. Children, if any, are unknown.
- E31 Mahlon Baldwin³ (Stacey² John¹) was born ca. 1815 (76) in Middleburg, VA; d. Oct. 11, 1858 at Powell's Shop in Loudoun Co., VA. (171) He, apparently was unmarried. His occupation was blacksmith. He left a will in which he specified that his slave woman, Jane Toliver, and her son Gilmore should be set free. His assets were to be held by his executors, John S. Ross and Herod Thomas and paid to Gilmore when he was 21. (141:A398) This Will was challenged by Mahlon's brothers: Joseph, William, and Stacey Baldwin; his sister, Lucinda Jones and several McVeigh relatives, but eventually by 1866 it was upheld. (172)

He m. on 2nd, 9mo., 1885 at Hopewell M.M., Rebecca Tharesa Wright, dau. of Jesse & Lydia H. (Griffith) Wright. (217:699) She was b. 23rd, 9mo., 1853. (6:460) Samuel R. Baldwin became a prosperous farmer in Frederick Co., VA; res. near Rest, VA in a house where George Washington was said to have been a guest. (217:699) He was a member of the Society of Friends. Their children were: William Wright, Mary Alice and Samuel Wright, and Elizabeth Hyde Baldwin. (92:448)

E33 Benjamin Franklin Baldwin³ (James² John¹) was born Aug. 28, 1820 in Middleburg, VA. On Dec. 18, 1863, he married Elizabeth Hill Young at Northfield, NH. She was b. Mar. 11, 1837 in Laconia, NH; d. Mar. 11, 1896 in Grafton, WV. (174) He was living in Grafton, Taylor Co., WV in 1877 when he corresponded with Charles Candee Baldwin and submitted his family record for publication in the "Baldwin Genealogy" of 1881.
