To know all men by these presents that we Martin McCloud  
and George Jay of the County of Muskingum in the State of Ohio  
acknowledge to owe  
the sum of three hundred dollars to the payment of which sum  
well and truly to be made we bind ourselves our heirs executors  
and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these  
presents sealed with our seals signed and dated at Can-  
-ville the 27<sup>th</sup> day of November 1821.

The condition of the above obligation is such that  
whereas the Court of Common Pleas of Muskingum County have  
this day appointed Martin McCloud guardian to take charge  
of Peter Romine an insane person,

Now if the said Martin McCloud do faithfully discharge  
the trust reposed in him as guardian to said Peter Romine  
and render a true and just account of his guardianship  
agreeably to law whenever thereunto required by said Court  
then this obligation to be void otherwise to be and  
remain in full force and virtue.
