This Indenture made the 8th day of June
in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and thirty two between James Silver and
Mary his wife of the County of Muskingum and State of Ohio
of the first part and Hannah Baldwin of the County and State
aforesaid of the second part for and in consideration of the sum
Twenty dollars in hand paid by the said party of the second
part the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged
both bargained and sold remised and quit claimed and
by these presents both bargain sell remise and quit claimed unto
the said party of the second part and to his heirs and
assigns forever all our right and interest of Eight Acres of
land lying and being in the County of Muskingum and State
of Ohio being in the 3rd quarter and first township and range
United States Military land and adjoining lands on the East
by John McMechan on the South by Peter Livingston and
the said Silver and on the West by the said Silver and
on the North by Henry Perigo and John Livingston it being
the tract of land that Samuel Baldwin died seised and
in possession of together with all and singular the heredita-
ments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise
appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder and
remainders unto issues and profits thereof and also all the
estate right title interest claim or demand whatsoever of
them the said parties of the above bargained premises and
every part and parcel thereof to the party of the second part his
heirs and assigns to the only proper use benefit and behoof of
the party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever
