In the name of God Amen: I Thomas Byars of said State and County being of advanced age but of sound and disposing mind and memory, knowing that I must shortly depart this life, deem it right and proper both as respects myself and family, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I do therefore make this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

First I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my condition and circumstances in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly - I desire and direct that all my just debts to be paid without delay by my executors hereinafter named and appointed.

Thirdly - I give bequeath and devise to my beloved daughter Josephine and her heirs and assigns, and my sewing Machine free from all charge and limitation whatever, to her own proper use benefit and behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as she may deem proper.

Fourthly - I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Thomasine lots of land Nos. 195 and 196 in 7th District and 4th Section of Walker County containing three hundred and twenty acres (320) more or less with all the rights members and appurtenances to said lots of land in any belonging free from all charges and limitation whatever, to her own proper use and benefit and behoof for and during her natural life, and at her death to be equally divided between her bodily heirs; I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife my household and kitchen furniture and all my other personal property, to her own proper use benefit and behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as she may deem proper.

Fifthly - I hereby appoint my sons Augustus B. and Brewster B. Byars executors of this my last Will and Testament.
