Thirdly: I desire and direct that all my property shall be equally divided between all my children to wit Mancy L. Alley, Elizabeth A. Bryan, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Mary E. Trotter, wire of William Trotter for her sole and separate use for and during her natural life, free exempt from the debts and liabilities of her present or future husband. At the death of my daughter Mary E. Trotter, shall pass to and become the property of the children and representatives of children of said Mary E. Trotter forever, Linsey I. Dooley, Sarah A. Seity, Thomas J. Dooley and James W. Dooley at my death.

Fourthly: I hereby constitute and appoint my sons, Thomas J. Dooley and James W. Dooley executors of this my last will and testament this January 20, 1862.
