How Calm They Sleep

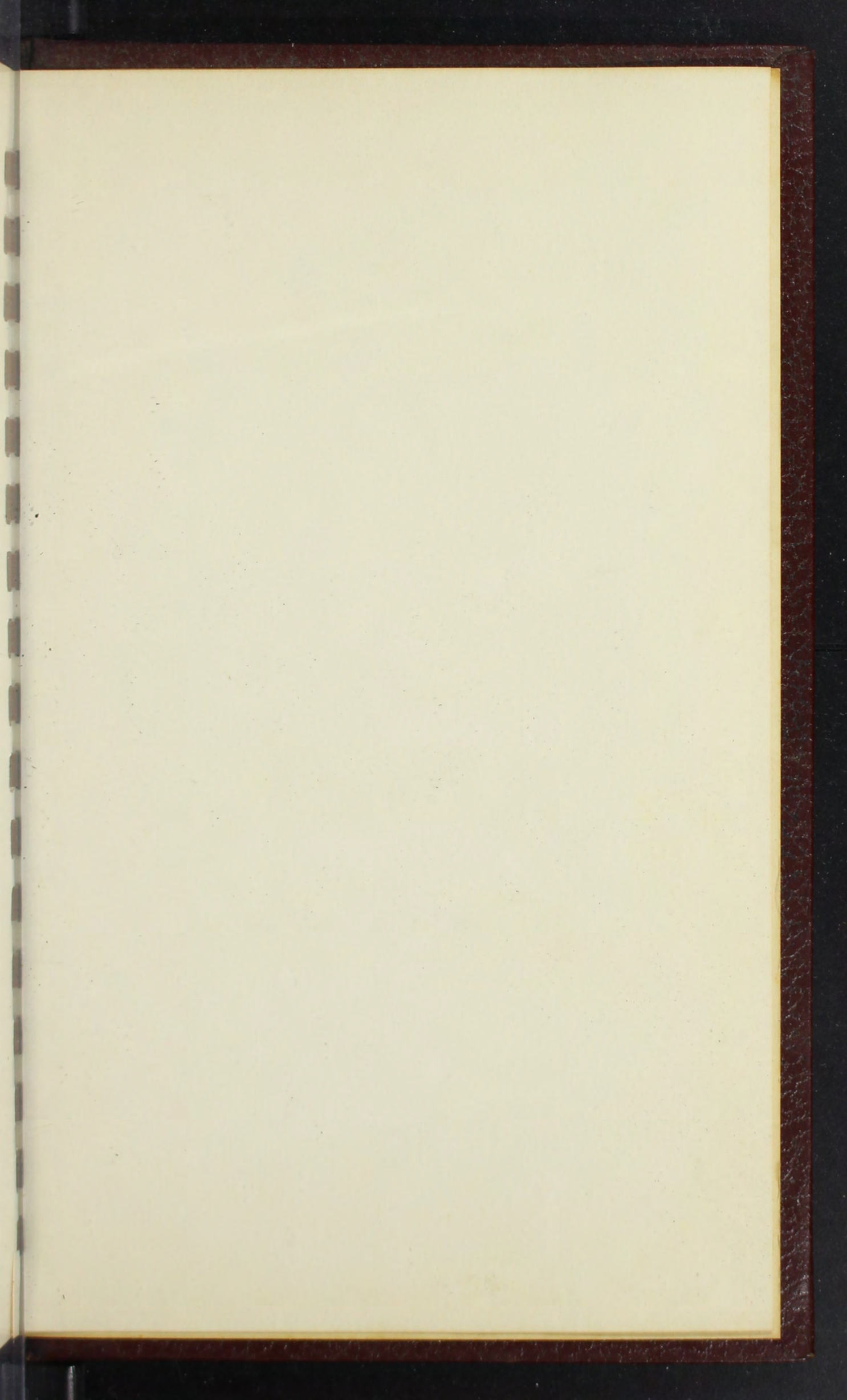
*How calm they sleep beneath the shade
