It is my will to give five Dollars to my son Thomas Lewis, It is my will to give fifteen Dollars to my son Daniel Lewis, It is my will to give and bequeath Twenty Dollars to my Daughter Martha Lewis. the above mentioned sums and to be paid out after the death of my wife Margaret Lewis, and out of the proceeds of the two premises, which I authorized her to sell, for her support and maintenance during her lifetime, Then it is my will and Testament, That my three children viz., Lewis Lewis, David Lewis should have equal shares of whatever may be the balanced of the said above described Two Lots of land after their mothers death.
