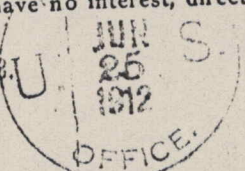

Act Approved April 19, 1908

The Certificate of the Prothonotary or Clerk of the Court need NOT be attached hereto but will be procured, if at all, when called for by the Commissioner of Pensions.

On the date hereinbefore mentioned, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public within and for the County and State aforesaid Amanda E. Magruder aged 59 years, a resident

of the City of McAlester County of Pittsburg, State of Oklahoma who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Samuel G. Magruder who enlisted under the name of

Samuel G. Magruder at Wheeling, W. Va. on the 7th day of August, A. D., 1862, in Company "H" 15th Regiment West. Virginia Here state rank, company, and regiment, if in the military service; or vessel if in the Navy.

Ninety days in the late war of the Rebellion, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED June - 14th 1865 and died Feb - 2 - 1913 at McAlester, Oklahoma State date of death. The cause of death need not be stated. State place of death

That she was married under the name of Amanda G. Hogan to said Samuel G. Magruder on the 18th day of March 1868, by Rev. Sluter at Brunswick

Missouri there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that she had never been previously married; that he had never been previously married.

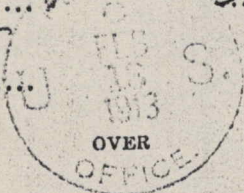

Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 272,782, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office that Samuel G. Waggoner was enrolled on the 7th day of August, 1862, at Wheeling, Va., in Co. "B" 15th Regiment of W. Virginia Infantry Volunteers, to serve three years or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 1st day of October, 1862, at Wheeling, Va., in Co. "B", 15th Regiment of W. Virginia Infantry Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Rolls of Co. "B" of that Regiment, for the months of to June 30, 1863, he is reported present (without remark). The Company was stationed at Sully Creek B. & O. R. R. during the early part of 1863. July & August 1863 absent sick in Hospital at Cumberland Mtd. since August 28, 1863. Similar report to October 31, 1864. Nov. & Dec. 1864 absent, detached in Purveyor's Office Cumberland Mtd. since Sept 15, 1863. Same to Feb. 28, 1865. March & April 1865 present Private, honorably mustered out with the Company June 14, 1865, at Richmond, Va.

The records of this Office do not furnish any evidence of rupture during 1863 as claimed.
