



Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter relative to Norman B. McGruder, a soldier of the Revolutionary War.

The data contained herein were obtained from the papers on file in the Revolutionary War claim for pension, W.9542, based upon the military service of Norman Bruce Magruder in that war.

The date and place of birth and the names of the parents of Norman Bruce Magruder are not shown.

While a resident of Georgetown, now District of Columbia, Norman Bruce Magruder enlisted in 1781 and served as private in Captain George Bell's Company, Colonels William Murdook's and William Dickey's Maryland Regiments length of service more than six months.

He lived in Washington County, that part which was later called Allegany County, Maryland, thirty-one years, and about 1814 he moved to Switzerland County, Indiana.

He was allowed pension on his application executed in 1832, at which time he was a resident of Switzerland County, Indiana, his age is not shown.

He died February 16, 1836, in Switzerland County, Indiana.

Soldier married December 25,1783, in Washington County, Karyland, Nancy Paugh, who was born in Allegany County, Maryland. She was the daughter of Michael Paugh. The name of her mother is not stated.

Soldier's widow, Nancy Magruder, was allowed pension on her application executed January 1,1845, at which time she was reciding in Louisville, Jefferson County, Enntucky, with her granddaughter, her name not designated. Various

statements were made in regard to Nancy Magruder's age that she was born in 1777, that she was aged sixty—nine years in 1836, that she was aged sixty—eight years in 1845, and that she was aged seventy—five years in 1845.

Norman Bruce Magruder and Nancy had three children: Mary or Polly, born December 30,1784, James, born February 12, 1786, and Sarah or Sally, born May 2,1789. Said Mary and James died prior to 1814. Said Sarahmarried, date and place not stated, Amos Gilbert, his age not given. They were both dead in 1845, dates and place of deaths not stated.

In 1844 Amity MacMillen and Elijah Gilbert, grandchildren of soldier and Nanoy Magrader, were living in Vevsy, Switzerland County Indians, their ages or the names of their parents were not designated.

ln1845 a son, nine years old, of a granddaughter of Nancy Magrader, soldier's widow, was referred to, no names were designated.

In 1845 Isaac Paugh, a half brother of soldier's widow, Nancy, was living in Ripley County, Indiana, his age not shown. There are no further family data.





EXPLANATORY NOTES.

* QUERE V. In a case where the applicant cannot, by reason of the loss of memory, state precisely how long he served, he should amend his declaration by making an ufficiavit in the following words:

Personally appeared before me, the undersigned, a Justice of the Peace, &c. A. B. who, being duly sworn, deposeth and saith, that, by reason of old age, and the consequent loss of memory, he cannot swear positively as to the precise length of his service, but according to the best of his recollection he served not less than the periods mentioned below, and in the following grades: For year ______ months and ______ days. I served as a ______ For _____ months and ______ days, I served as a ______ sand for such service I claim a pension.

It is important in all cases to determine with precision the period for which the applicant served, and the particular rank he held, as the law directs the pension to be paid according to the grade of the pensioner and the length of his service. The use of the phrase about three or four months is too indefinite, and all such qualifying expressions are objectionable.

QUERE XIV. Proof of Service.

In a case where the name of the applicant is not found on the records of the Department, he must prove his service by two credible witnesses, who are required to set forth in their affidavits the time of the claimants entering the service, and the time and manner of his leaving the same, as well as the regiment, company, and line to which be belonged. QUERE XVI. Mode of authenticating papers.

In every instance where the certificate of the certifying officer who authenticated the papers is not written on the same sheet of paper which contains the affidavit, or other paper authenticated, the certificate must be attached thereto by a piece of tape or narrow ribbon, the end of which must pass under the seal of office of the certifying officer, so as to prevent any paper from being improperly attached to the certificate.
