

State of Virginia } On this 24<sup>th</sup> day of December in  
Newton County } the year 1882 personally appeared in  
open court before the Justice of the  
Superior Court for said County - now sitting Henry  
Gully a resident of said County - aged 53 years, who  
being first duly sworn according to law, oath on his  
oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain  
the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832  
"That he entered the service of the United States under the  
following named officers, and served as herein stated -  
That in the year 1780 - or 1781 - he entered the service  
under Captain Elisha White - where he continued for  
the term of one month - that he then enlisted in  
Harrison County - Virginia - under Lieutenant Robert  
Green - Captain Morgan - Colonel Richard Camp-  
bell - in the first Virginia Regiment - that he marched  
to Charlefield, Va. - thence to Guilford  
County - thence to Camden Ga. - thence to Camden  
South Carolina, and to Cambridge - that he was in the battle  
at Camden - that after having served in his second re-  
giment for the term of eighteen months - he received  
a discharge on the 17<sup>th</sup> of January, 1782 - at Salisbury,  
which is hereto annexed

This deponent further saith that volunteered a third time  
and served one month - but does not recollect any of his  
officers - that he has no documentary evidence other than  
that which is hereto annexed  
and that he knows of no person, whose testimony he can  
procure, who can testify to his service - He hereby relinquishes  
every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the  
present, and declares that his name is not on the pension  
roll of the agency of any State - Given to & subscribed the

a soldier of the Revolution, and that we concur in that

That the abovesaid applicant was a revolutionary soldier  
and served as he states - And the Court further certifies

who has signed the foregoing certificate is a clergyman  
residing in said County of Weston - and James Ellington  
who has also signed the same is a citizen of said County and  
is a credible person, & that their statement is entitled to  
credit -
